The expenses of my trip to Canada which includes travel fare and accommodation expenses will be sponsored by my mother. We have immovable assets of CAD 4,35,387.54. Gold ornaments and vehicles owned by us are almost CAD 30,521.00. None of the family members has any liabilities pending against our names. I have enclosed a net worth certificate with my profile which can confirm that I and my family have an accumulated wealth of CAD 49,723.67. 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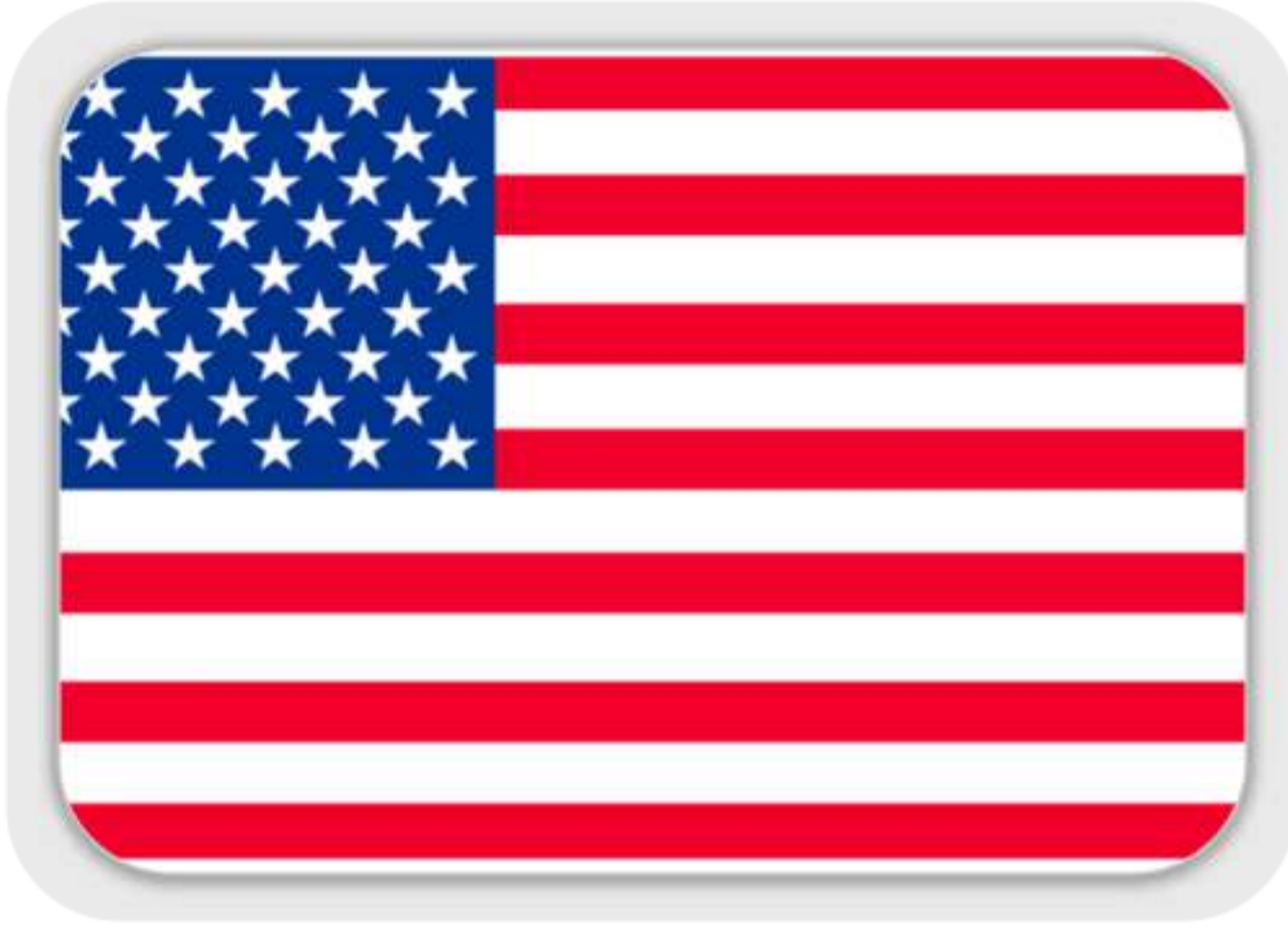
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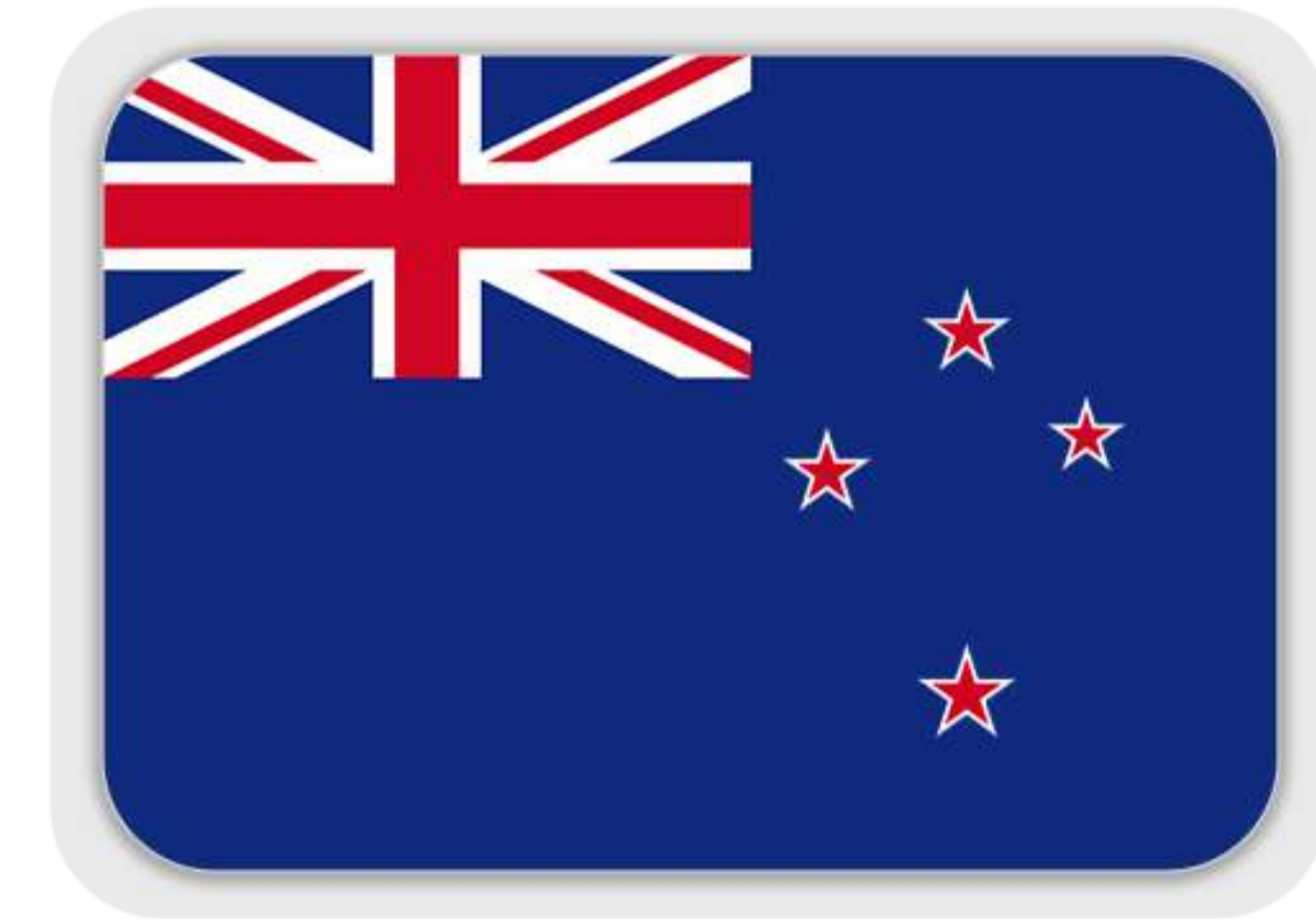
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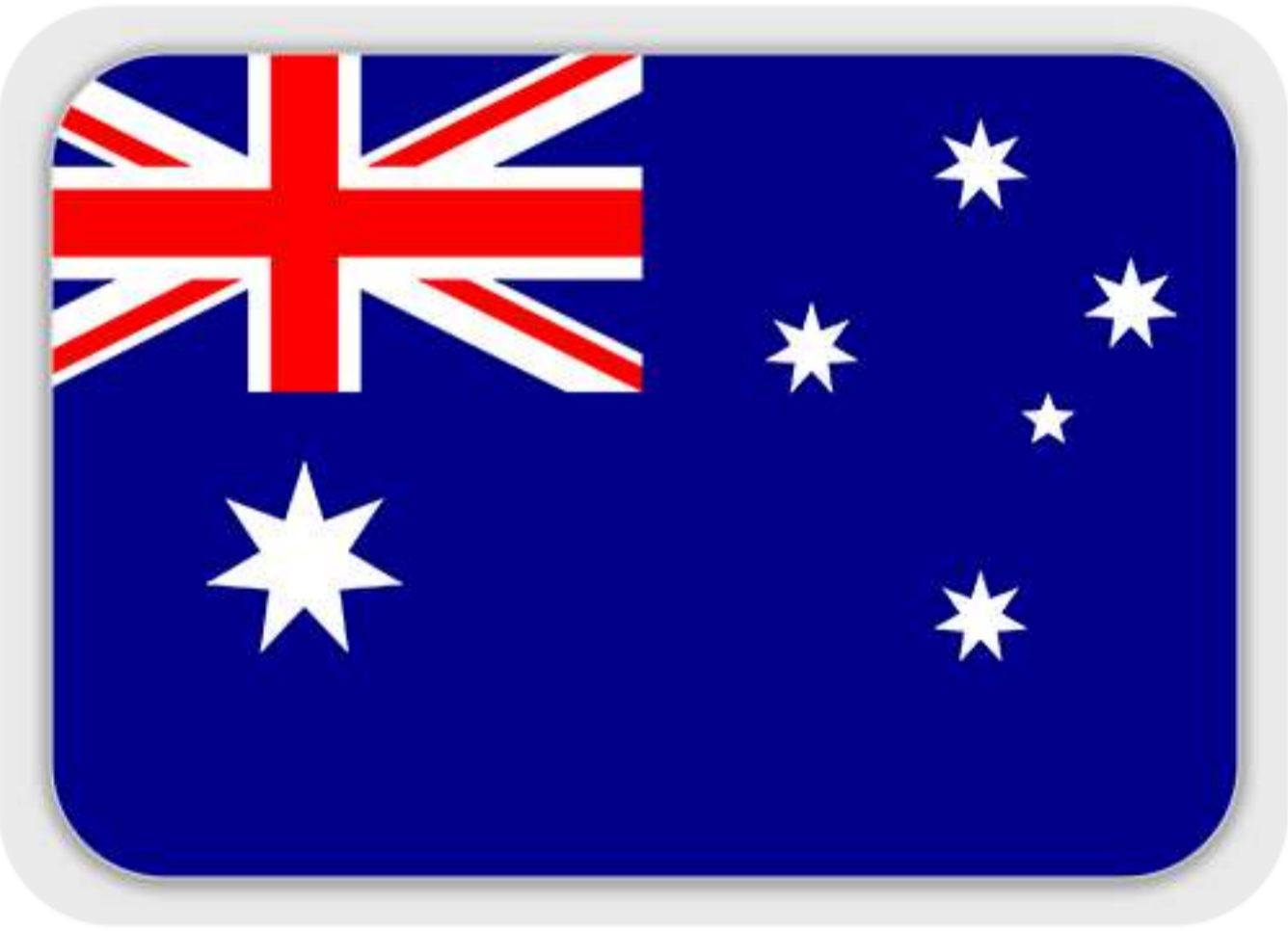
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
